Michael Keegan-Dolan and Teać Damsa have created another mythic yet timely production that acknowledges how life's opposing tensions and contradictions can on occasion come together and find resolution.

MÁM follows on from the stunning of Swan Lake/ Loch na hEala which was performed in An Grianán in 2018. It is a meeting place between soloist and ensemble, classical and traditional, the local and universal. It brings together the virtuoso, Irish traditional concertina player Cormac Begley, the European classical, contemporary collective, s t a r g a z e, a young girl and twelve international dancers from the Teać Damsa company.

The show was nominated for an Olivier Award for Best New Dance Production in 2020 and was nominated for two UK National Dance Awards in 2021. Teać Dańsa's distinct approach to creating MÁM has been documented by film-maker Pat Collins in his film The Dance (2021).

SUPPORTS

An Grianán Supports



We have just finished a month-long residency by Michelle Read and Brian Keegan, who worked with Victor Yelamo and members of the Donegal Camerata on developing their show, Like a House on a Fire, and a series of workshops and performances. Recently we've had local performers and writers Maggie Hannon and Sean Donegan in for a week developing ideas for new show HeArt Therapy. We also had a reading of Sean Byrne's script for a new play One Night in Glenlough with actors Charlie Bonner and Patrick McBrearty. Back in February we worked with Ultan Pringle on his radio play Marmalade Row, which we delivered online.

We've been working with Letterkenny writer Brenda Kelly, one of our Bursary recipients in 2021, on her musical play ODD for a while now. The next step, happening in late July, is a two day development session with five professional actors, led by Christina Nelson as Director and Fionn Robinson as musical composer, and a choreographer. We've also been working with Kieran Kelly on his new play Jimmy's Winning Matches which is currently scheduled to debut in January 2023. Another project that's been happening over a couple of years is development of AB Khan's The She Kings, and they have just finished the second draft of their play.

We also provided seed funding for writers Oisin Kearney and Michael Patrick for their project Wheel of Justice, and we are currently in talks about their new project, a version of An Táin. REVVED which we've brought from development to the stage, has its Donegal tour this month, as part of this year's Earagail Arts Festival, and will be in the Lyric Theatre, Belfast this November. There will be another Jazz Navigator Residency this September, in association with the Improvised Music Company, building on the great work done in last year's residency with Cormac McCarthy. September will also see The North West Dance Residency with Brian Gillespie. Once again we are working with two Young Curators, Ailís Cross-Gorman and Fergal Lonergan, to curate a series of shows and events for the theatre

DRAMA-CAST

DramaCast was a highlight of our lockdown projects: a free online digital study aid for second level students that will be an invaluable resource for many years to come.



DramaCast is just what students and teachers need: the ways key scenes in these plays are presented make the characters and ideas real in a way that no classroom can truly do. They bring us into the worlds of these stories.



DramaCast emerged as a silver lining from a pandemic that closed theatres, leaving artists out of work and prevented students from attending plays and participating in school productions.

Two key moments from Macbeth, Philadelphia, Here I Come! and Romeo and Juliet were rehearsed, performed and filmed on the stage of An Grianan. <u>The films are available on our website at</u> <u>angrianan.com.</u>

The project was a collaboration between An Grianán Theatre and Workhouse Theatre Company, with Iarla McGowan as Director, and St Eunan's College English Teacher Michael Kelly as Creative Director, and was filmed by An Grianán's technical staff, under the supervision of Director of Photography, Karen Quinn of ATU Donegal. Online accessibility allows students to engage with prescribed plays. DramaCast can be viewed repeatedly, allowing students to mine every nuance of the pivotal scenes in relation to character, relationships, themes and language, and allowing DramaCast to be used by teachers in the classroom and by students as they study at home.

Professional actors Patrick McBrearty, Megan Armitage, Troy Devaney, Aoife Lennon and Diarmuid Doherty breathe new life into canonical characters, allowing students a fresh perspective to complement existing film productions. The films offer modern and cutting edge reimaginings of Shakespeare in Hiberno-English explicitly for students, and also for the enjoyment of drama enthusiasts everywhere.
